Neuroworx is a nonprofit, community-based, outpatient physical therapy clinic focusing on neurological rehabilitation for adults and children experiencing paralysis from spinal cord injury and other neurological conditions. We do this by giving **MORE**:

- **MORE THERAPY SESSIONS**
- **MORE TIME PER SESSION**
- **MORE INTENSIVE THERAPY**
- **MORE SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT**

Neuroworx is the only independent facility of its kind in the Intermountain West. We have treated nearly 1000 patients from 26 US states and 4 foreign countries.

Did You Know?

- › There are 12,500 new spinal cord injury cases annually in the US.
- › There are currently an estimated 1.25 million individuals in the US living with paralysis
- › Healthcare costs for the first year following a spinal cord injury can reach nearly \$1.1 million.
- › The majority of individuals with paralysis receive inadequate rehabilitation due to shortened length of hospital stays and very restricted outpatient therapy benefits

Jule was born with a rare neurological condition called Hemimegalencephaly. A condition in which one side of the brain is abnormally larger than the other, causing frequent seizures and quadriplegia paralysis.
